The purpose of each scholarship is to provide an opportunity for the recipient to take advantage of post education options to improve their chances of getting a good job and ultimately to secure and maintain self-sufficiency. I am also proud to announce that the ALPI Northern Region Advisory Council has begun the creation of another scholarship to be presented to an eligible Northern Region high school graduate. All scholarships are funded through donations and ad sponsorships.




Hobe Sound Nature Center Visits ALPI Morningside Head Start Center


The children of Morningside Head Start Center got the best visit from the rescued wildlife of Hobe Sound

FATHERS in Community Action



The ALPI Nurturing Fatherhood Program in Polk County is a male driven program encouraging participation from the fathers in the program, empowering fathers in the home, and educating families on the important role that male figures play in early childhood development.

ALPI Nurturing Fatherhood Program – Polk County is dedicated to partnering with fathers and parents to encourage

strong relationships between parents and children and to set the foundation for lifelong involvement in their children's education. This year the NFP hosted its 2nd Annual Nurturing Fatherhood Spring Event, "Kidz Cook off with Nutrition in Mind," at the Frostproof Child Development Center on April 20, 2012. Activities for this event were coordinated by Bertram Smith, Program Operations Director, together with fathers from the program. This event was open to the whole family for a fun filled day aimed at raising awareness towards physical fitness, nutrition, mental wellness, and the importance of family meal times.

Activities were not only fun, but educational. Parent training was provided by the Health Services Manager, Amarilis Garcia, and Food Service Coordinator, Hilda Walker. This year the male involvement from fathers, grandfathers, uncles, and father figures grew from 20 to 35 participants. The Nurturing Fatherhood Program meetings are held monthly and follow a curriculum for developing attitudes and skills for male nurturing in the home.

HANDS DENTAL CLINIC

FROSTPROOF CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER RIBBON CUTTING and OPEN HOUSE

In 2009, the Agricultural and Labor Program received a grant to service Early Head Start children. This grant brought numerous positive changes to the Head Start/Early Head Start Program in both St. Lucie and Polk Counties. The Frostproof Development Center experienced some of those changes. The number of children serviced grew from fifty-four (54) children to a capacity of ninety-four (94) children, comprised of both Head Start

and Early Head Start children. Staff capacity also grew and the agency was able to create employment opportunities in an economy where unemployment was growing. As a result, we also experienced growth in the number of parents, volunteers, and community partners involved with the center.

The center itself also underwent numerous

On May 8, 2012 ALPI's Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) hosted its 3rd Annual In-Service Day Training for Sub-Recipient Agencies. Sixteen (16) agencies were in attendance, along with the Community Services Department staff.

The agenda included a complete review of the revised LIHEAP application, worksheet, vendor commitment forms, etc. Each agency's LIHEAP Agreement was reviewed and discussed individually with the LIHEAP Director, advising of the program changes and addressing increased oversight, tracking and monitoring expenditures.

ALPI's Low Income Home Energy Assistance program is currently providing energy benefits in thirty-two (32) sites within seven counties!
