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# **CEO's CORNER**

### **CHANGE READINESS**

As we come to the end of another fiscal year, I am reminded of the many challenges that have been thrust upon the Agricultural and Labor Program, Inc., due in part to the federal government sequestration budget cut legislation. A great deal of focus has been placed upon those of us who have been charged with the responsibility of securing and managing federal and state resources for the sole purpose of providing programs and services to meet the needs of economically challenged families. A significant challenge facing us now is the request to reduce our budget by more than half a million dollars by July 1, 2013. These collective challenges emphasize the need for a change in the way we currently do business.

Dr. Steve Barlow, a change management consultant and trainer specializing in change readiness and its implications for organizational change, reminds us in his article entitled "What is Change Readiness" that the concept of change readiness is often misunderstood by many people. It is possible that people who are ready for change are compliant and/or ready to engage in programs. However, it is equally possible that people who are ready to comply, or ready to do a program, are not ready to change. Actually, one cannot tell whether a person is ready based solely on their compliance or program readiness.

Enabling change is an often difficult process simply because organizations are human systems. Even when what is being changed is technology, processes or structures, the success of the transformation will ultimately depend on the people who will implement these changes.

In a fast-changing environment, organizations are constantly faced with the need to reinvent themselves or to undergo transformations to remain relevant and competitive. Change is no longer a matter of choice, but a necessary tool for survival. We at ALPI have already put change readiness strategies into motion. We pledge to do "whatever it takes" so that we may continue to consistently demonstrate compliance readiness and program service delivery readiness. We are ready to embrace the effort ... embrace the challenge ... embrace the change.

ALPI's Garden Terrace Head Start Center was recently featured on NBC Nightly News in a news piece on President Obama's Universal Pre-K Plan. The plan would offer "high quality education" for all four year olds from low-income families. Studies show that 74% of four year olds are enrolled in Pre-K programs. But, experts say only about one-third are high quality programs and they argue that early education leads to higher graduation rates. Preschool affects entry into kindergarten and much of this persists all the way from school throughout adulthood.

While fighting back tears, Shawnette Bembry, mother of 5 year old Tyrese Wilford, stated "Early education has made all the difference. My kids are excelling in school and I'm just grateful." As the debate continues, Florida parents at Garden Terrace Head Start Center agree that its simply worth the investment.

ALPI is happy to report that after the filming of this news piece, Tyrese Wilford successfully graduated from Garden Terrace Head Start Center and is excited about starting Kindergarten in the Fall.

# **QUALIFYING CRITERIA IS:**

- Must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or have a U.S. work permit.
- Income eligible (70% LLSIL)
- Must be a farmworker or dependent of a farmworker over 18 years of age.
- At least 50% of the household income must be derived from farm work and must have earned at least \$800 in farm work during the previous 12-24 month period.
- Male applicants ONLY born after 1959 must be registered for Selective Service.
