

Digital Television Transition



By June 12, 2009, all television stations in the United States will stop analog broadcasts. Digital broadcasting promises to provide a clearer picture and more programming options and will free up airwaves for use by emergency responders. As a result of this, Congress created the TV Converter Box Coupon Program for households wishing to keep

using their analog TV sets after broadcasters stop analog broadcasting. The Program allows U.S. households to obtain up to two coupons, each worth \$40, that can be applied toward the cost of eligible converter boxes. To apply for the coupon, log on to www. dtv2009.gov and follow the directions.



The SUNCAP Program is a special Food Stamp Program for individuals who receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI). You may be eligible to receive food stamps through the SUNCAP Program without any additional application,

paperwork or interviews. If you already receive foods stamps, you may be converted automatically to the SUNCAP Program when you become SSI eligible. For more information, please visit www.myflorida.com/accessflorida.

2009 Annual Conference Speaker:


William "Sonny" Walker, Ph.D.

SafeLink Wireless is a government supported program that provides a free cell phone and airtime each month for income-eligible customers. You qualify for Lifeline Service in your area if you already participate in one of the following assistance programs: Federal Public Housing Assistance/Section 8; Food Stamps; Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP); Supplemental Security Income (SSI); National School Lunch (free program only); Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or your total household income is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG).
